Academy of Hair Design, Inc will be dividing the grant into six equal amounts and disbursed over a 6-month period starting in May 2020 through October 2020.

The monthly amount will be determined by the number of Active Students on the 1st day of the month and and paid out to students. The amounts student will receive are determined by their Program Academic Year. One-year programs will receive 50% and Two-Year Programs will 100% of the allotted monthly amount.

To qualify students must:

- Accept the grant award provided to them from the funding made available to the institution under the CARES Act.
- Verified current address in student data base where check will be mailed
- Is currently an active student clocking hours
- Student is eligible for Title IV Federal Financial Aid
 - Proof includes current FAFSA
